Perspectives on two key initiatives that place artists and culture at the heart of the journey towards environmental transition:

- In Edinburgh, Creative Carbon Scotland was founded in 2011 to support different cultural figures to measure their carbon footprint. Ten years later, the organization is focusing on the ways in which artists can accelerate the transformation of societal models.
- In Montréal, the brand-new Campus de la transition écologique seeks to leverage public and community assets to speed up environmental transition through research activity, experimentation and raising awareness. Art and culture will play a key role in these actions as powerful vectors for change.
